## TABLING CHECKLIST

Whether you're a tabling virgin or the guru of all things tabled, go over this checklist each and every time you table. You may not have everything on the list, but if you can take it along, then you definitely want to.

**Sign-up sheet**

First on the list because it's the most important. A sign-up sheet comes in the tabling pack, and you can print them off the Web site. There's no excuse for not bringing the sign-up sheet.

**Literature** (leaflets, stickers, posters)

E-mail PETA2@peta.org if you need literature, but don't wait until the last minute. It takes us a week or more to get stuff shipped.

**Friend**

You weren't planning on tabling by yourself, were you? Who'd watch the table while you walked around the venue getting signups or went to the bathroom?

**PETA T-shirt**

If you've got it, flaunt it. No PETA T? Make your own (PETA2 stencils are perfect for this), or wear the closest thing you've got.

**CD-ROMs**

We'll send you one with the tabling pack, but please burn as many copies as you can and give them out to people who sign up.

**Pens**

No pens means no signups, and that's bad!

**Clipboards**

Clipboards allow you to walk around the venue and down the line getting signups.

**Clear tape**

For putting up posters in a visible place in front of or behind the table.

**Rubber bands**

Rubber bands are very important for outdoor venues and shows. High winds kill the perfect table—you need something to keep the leaflets from blowing away.

**Table**

Call the venue to see if you need to take one.

**TV/VCR combo or laptop**

For showing videotapes.

**"Meet Your Meat" loop**

If you have a TV/VCR to take, we'll gladly send you a looped copy of the video.

**Lamp**

Have you ever been to a show? They get pretty dark. A lamp will enable people to read the literature and sign up anyway.

**Extension cord and powerstrip**

If you have a TV/VCR, laptop, and lamp, you'll need to plug them all in somewhere.

**Name and number of your contact person at the venue**

Also take the phone number of your contact at PETA if you're tabling for us. You never know when you might run into trouble.

**Driver's license, school ID, or the most official-looking ID you have**

You'll need this in order to get into the show.

**Bottled water**

You don't want to have to leave the table unattended when you get thirsty.

**A BIG smile**

It's important to be super, super friendly to everyone (especially workers at a venue or people involved with the bands). Thank everyone for everything. Don't give people an excuse to dismiss animal rights—that's the last thing animals need. Plus, tabling is fun, so why wouldn't you smile?
